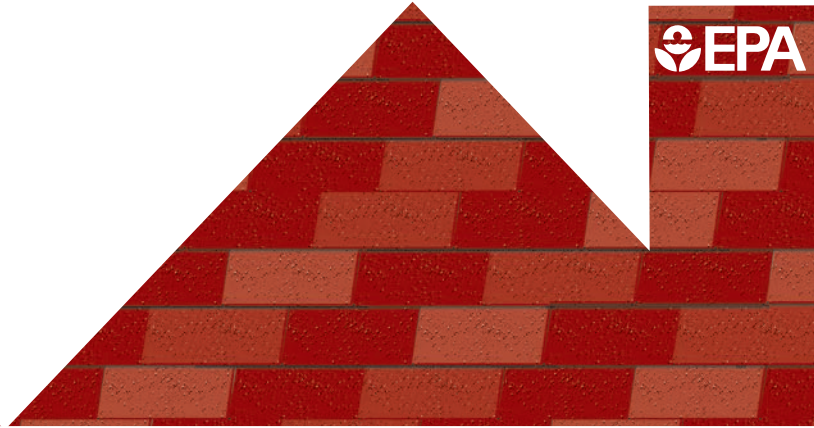

January is Radon Action Month
 Radon is a radioactive gas that comes from uranium in rocks and soil, found in all 50 states. Radon can seep into homes where it can become trapped and build up to high levels.
Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer.
 The Surgeon General recommends all homes be tested for radon.
 Wintertime is a good time to test your home for indoor radon.
 EPA estimates that one in 15 homes in the U.S. has high radon levels.
 Any home, new or old, with or without a basement, can have a radon problem.
 Homes right next door to each other can have very different radon levels.
 Call your local County or State Health Department to learn more about testing your home.
